1. Strengths and successes of the program as evidenced by the data, analysis and reflection:

As the SAC has not produced Part A yet, we look forward to their analysis of this data for Humanities, Integrated Studies, International Studies, and Religious Studies in the 2021-22 Annual Discipline Update. Institutional Effectiveness has created a more robust tool for data analysis ([located at this web page](#)). We encourage you to reach out to us and Institutional Effectiveness with questions or need support in extracting the data.

2. Areas of challenge or concern, if any:

Please consider reviewing the success rates for students based on disaggregated race and ethnicity data. Look closely at pass rates less than 70% in some groups and disparity of more than 10% between racialized groups. For example:

International Studies for 2019-2020 - there were 110 students: 57% white; 86% pass rate; Asian 10%, 80% pass; Latinx 19%, 73.4% pass rate; 6% multi-racial 6 students, 50% pass rate. 5% Black, 5 students, 0% pass rate.

Humanities for 2019-2020 - there were 1,161 students: 56% white, 78.5% pass rate; 5% Asian, 83.6% pass rate; 18% Latinx, 70.6% pass rate; 9% multi-racial students, 77.3% pass rate; 8% Black, 59.6% pass rate.

3. Reflection on goals and resources:

As you assess the signature assignments please see above requests regarding understanding success rates of students based on race and ethnicity.

Regarding offering more International Studies sections Dana met with Martha, Ron and Bryan 1/11/22 to discuss expanding the pool of instructors to teach INTL and rotating offering INTL 201 across the college. Data was provided to the INTL SAC regarding instructors and past INTL schedules. We remain committed to offering INTL district wide and welcome recommendations from the SAC.

Regarding the Religion 210 online D2L shell update, Online Learning has recently received approval to support facilitating the update of the World Religions (R210) D2L shell. This work is likely to start spring 2022.

Additional time for SACs to work outside of the 2x per year meetings is a need that has been recognized by Administration. We are looking forward to working with the SAC to find ways to maintain continuity of work between SAC meeting.
