- 1. Strengths and successes of the program as evidenced by the data, analysis and reflection:
 - The Occupational Skills Training (OST) program has a success rate of over 80%.
 - The program was able to use the transition to online learning as a springboard for updating forms and shifting from a paper based process to electronic.
 - OST has maintained relationships with referrers such as Veterans Affairs, Vocational Rehabilitation, and private insurers in Oregon and Washington.
- 2. Areas of challenge or concern, if any:
 - Over the past three years the OST program has dropped from 135.7 FTE in 2018/19 to 2.7 FTE in 2020/21.
 - Low program enrollment continues to be a significant concern with less than 12 students currently enrolled in spring 2022.
 - The program enrollment does not support the current staffing model, which includes general fund and self-support budgets.
 - Additionally, there are technology issues that have led to gaps in data and reporting.

 - The OST program fulfills a very specific need for people with disabilities, who with the help of vocational counselors have the ability to engage in work-site learning as enrolled students in OST-101.
 - The OST program has more than adequate staffing resources to carry out the academic program.
