

Ciao! (*Hello!*) Welcome to *eTicket Italian*, from Living Language. Just listen to the native speakers of Italian and repeat in the pauses. Let's get started!

PRONUNCIATION

The phrases in *eTicket Italian* are written in both Italian and a simplified phonetic transliteration.

To help you recognize how to pronounce Italian words, here is a brief summary of pronunciation. All of the Italian vowels are presented below, as well as some difficult or representative vowel combinations and consonants.
