

- \checkmark Do not use do or does in the affirmative unless it has meaning.
- ✓ For the third person, (he, she, it or a name) add -s, -es or -ies to the end of the verb for the affirmative.
- \checkmark Do not add -s, -es, or ies to verbs in the negative, question or short answer.

Be Verb

- \checkmark Remember that in affirmative, negative and short answer sentences, the subject comes first and then the verb.
- ✓ For questions, the verb comes first and then the subject.
