- ✓ For the third person, (he, she, it or a name) add -s, -es or -ies to the end of the verb for the affirmative.
- ✓ Do not add -s, -es, or ies to verbs in the negative, question or short answer.

**Be Verb**

- ✓ Remember that in affirmative, negative and short answer sentences, the subject comes first and then the verb.
- ✓ For questions, the verb comes first and then the subject.
