
PHYSICAL SCIENCE – OCEANOGRAPHY











Course covers the science of our oceans. The geography, geology, physics, chemistry, weather, and biology of the oceans will be examined, with an emphasis on the Pacific Northwest, plus a half-day weekend field trip to the North Oregon Coast (date TBA). © This one-term survey course may be part of a year's sequence in physical science for college transfer credit.
