Discussion:

The discussion of course-sequence language falls under the bigger question of "What belongs in a course description?" and is part of an ongoing conversation about how to give SACs and the committee clear guidelines. The options presented to the committee to think about beforehand were for this particular case were:

> 1. let the SAC decide as long as they are internally consistent especially within a sequence

> 2. decide it does not belong in the course description let SACs know that by adding it to the style guide

> 3. decide it is part of a longer discussion about course descriptions and put it off til December for a more thorough discussion.

There was some feeling that that sequence information could be conveyed in the title or via the prerequisite courses but there was also a sense that including the language in the course description might help a student plan and so was useful. Eventually it was decided that option 1 should guide development of additions for the style guide.

Action: Curriculum office staff will prepare draft style guide statement to address the sequencing statements in the course description for the committee to review in December, e.g. This is the first course in a three-course sequence.
