- 1. Next year's meetings will be 3:00-5:00 pm at Sylvania with the exception of the December meeting which will be at the DTC.
- 2. Invitation to participate: representation by Curriculum Committee Members is needed for the following:

- 3. Assessment Strategy Discussion
  - a. Comm 112: Discussion of assessment strategies included explanation of some of the elements that might be expected in a persuasive speech that could be included in a rubric
  - b.
