Discussion Items

Kendra shares the NW Accreditation recommendation regarding general education and learning outcomes:

College continue its work in the area of general education learning outcomes, and in this context, ensure that all CTE degrees and certificates have related instruction components based on identifiable and assessable general education learning outcomes and that these areas are taught or monitored by teaching faculty who are appropriately qualified in those areas. Standard 2.C.11

1.General Education

Representatives from DAC, CC, and Learning Assessment Council have been talking about how our general ed courses meet the core outcomes. The LDC folks have been focusing on core outcomes for years and there is energy around higher ed to rethink what gen ed was supposed to do and what it should be doing now and how to do it better. Overarching themes: the point of gen ed is to develop broad integrative skills around critical thinking, problem solving and become a broader thinker. While make sure we're assessing where we say our values are, within the core outcomes. There's a team of people from PCC (Kendra, Anne, Janeen and Jeremy) going to Oklahoma City in June for a General Education Institute, there are about 40 other institutions that have been accepted to go. The institute is for Colleges in various stages of thinking around restructuring general education, implementing general education, getting buy in from all those impacted.

Related Instruction

It's not all that clear what NW is really looking for, but seemed like the evaluators wanted to see outcomes that related to the three areas of related instruction (computation, communication and human relations). It appears the related instruction recommendation ties in nicely with what we're trying to do around general education.

Majors

As a community college we currently aren't approved to put majors on our transcripts and our degrees. Some other community colleges have found ways to have unofficial majors in their catalog, but they also don't put them on transcripts or degrees. The Community Colleges have been told that they can offer majors and now we're waiting on the HEC to revise and approve the new OAR. The JTAC wants to discuss any parameters there might be around majors. With majors coming down the track, we might have two pockets of courses – courses within the major and courses with general education designation.

Instructor Qualifications

There have been many conversations around RI – do the three areas have to be taught by the faculty within those areas (MTH, COMM, and whatever discipline for Human Relations) or are the faculty that teach CTE courses the most appropriate; they are better prepared teach those areas within the context of their program and courses. When we implemented RI and Instructor Quals, we decided to count hours and display activities that address the hours, and then we added outcomes and instructor qualifications. Some SACs have an additional sentence in their Instructor Q's that speaks to RI qualification. With this new recommendation we'll need to seek clarity on what NW is looking for and maybe revise how we do related instruction for those certificates impacted.

Lastly, it's important that this Committee know the big topics; core outcomes, general education and related instruction, and look for opportunities to participate in conversations early.
